

This booklet is designed to help children develop a steady beat. Learning rhymes is a great way to develop concentration, memory, build strength in fingers and prepares children to read and write.

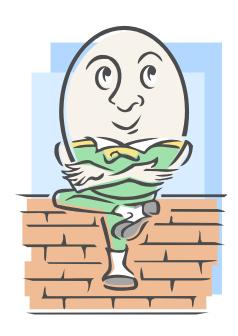

"Roll over, roll over."

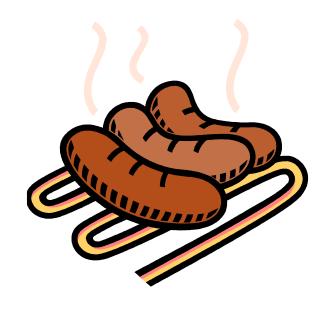
So they all rolled over and one fell out....

Activities to get both sides of the brain working together

2. The Body Swing

Stand up and bend your knees.
Let your head and shoulders hang forward.
Swing your arms slowly, to the left and then to the right.

See how many you can do!

3. Knock Knees

Stand with your legs slightly apart and bent.

Put your hands on you knees.

Move your knees together and as they touch, cross your hands to the opposite knees.

As you move your knees apart, uncross your hands to their starting position.

Repeat 10 times!
